Think about the different ways you could move? Jump, crawl, hop, tip toe, skip.

Using different tubs or containers, look at the mixed-up objects.

How could you sort them? (shape, pattern, colour)

How many beads/counters are in one group?

Which group has the most/least?

Read your favourite story to a family member, pet or teddy



Can you help your adult set the table?


- Is it breakfast, lunch or dinner?
- What do you need at the table? A bowl or plate- what are you eating?
- How many people are eating at the table?



Make a river out of paper or card.

Using different materials and blocks, can you create a strong enough bridge for your animal to cross without falling in?

- How will they cross the river? Why do they need to cross the river?
- How can you make the bridge strong?
- What happens when your animal stands on the bridge?
- How many blocks did you use?



Choose a story your familiar with.

- Look at the front cover, what do you think happens?
- Read the story to someone using the text or pictures?
- Can you find the letter 'a'?
- What do you notice about the character? (hair colour, what are they wearing, tall/short)

How will you fix things together? What will you make?




Adding Equations
