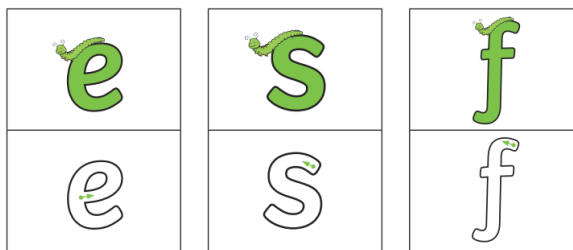
Complete 1 sentence a day

Tricky word reading

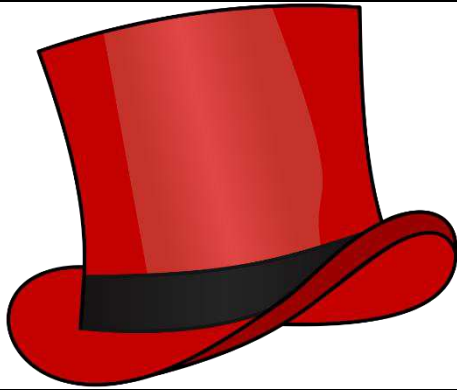
Have a go at reading my next 6 words. Colour them in once you can read them.

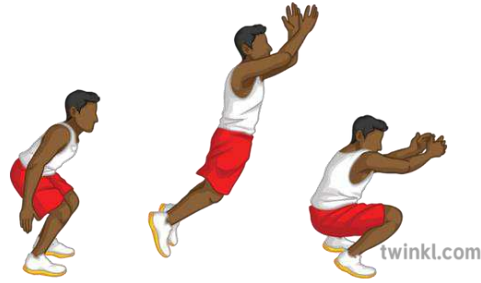
