
Complete 1 sentence a day

Tricky word reading


Have a go at reading my next 6 words. Colour them in once you can read them.

Baking


Can you read my instructions?


You could use a soft teddy if you don't have a ball.

Cook at 150 degrees for 25 minutes or until golden brown.


Secret writing
