BEST EVER NO-COOK PLAY DOUGH RECIPE

You need:

- 2 cups plain flour (all purpose)
- 2 tablespoons vegetable oil (baby oil and coconut oil work too)
- 1/2 cup salt
- 2 tablespoons cream of tartar
- 1 to 1.5 cups boiling water (adding in increments until it feels just right)
- gel food colouring (optional)
- few drops glycerine (my secret ingredient for stretch and shine!)

(I never use glycerin)

Just mix it all together and knead out the stickiness once it is cool enough to handle.
