


Challenge – Can you think of a word that starts with one of these letters?

Draw the shape of the gingerbread man. Can you fill the inside with adjectives all about the gingerbread man? Have a look at my example for some ideas.





Worry Jars



Gingerbread men



Art – gingerbread man collage

Create a worry jar to add your worries to. You can decorate it as you wish. Draw a picture or write down your worries and add them to the jar.



- You will need:
 - 350g Self Raising Flour
 - 1 tsp bicarbonate of soda
 - 1 tsp ground cinnamon
 - 4 tsp caster sugar
 - 4 oz butter
 - 6 tbsp golden syrup
 - Rolling pin
 - Biscuit cutters
 - Icing
1. Pre-heat the oven at 190C and add flour, bicarbonate of soda, cinnamon and sugar into a bowl and mix together.
 2. Melt the butter and golden syrup in a pan on a low heat, when melted pour over the ingredients & mix together.
 3. Once mixed, knead the dough and roll out to 5mm thick and cut into desired shapes.
 4. Space them onto a baking tray lined with greaseproof paper and cook for 5-12 minutes.

Let it cool, decorate and enjoy!

Retell a story
